### **Public Safety Education**

#### **Notable Projects**

Fire Prevention/Community Risk Reduction conducted (7) plan reviews in February, (0) license inspections for preschool , daycare facilities and/or home inspections for Adoption and Foster Care, (4) final acceptance tests for installed or upgraded fire protection systems or new businesses. There were (0) Freedom of Information Act Requests . There were (5) inspections with the State Fire Marshal Office and (5) Consultation requests from local businesses for safety and fire protection needs.

Fire Crews completed (34) inspections and re-inspections in February, finishing up from last year's process. Chief Froelich provided updated training for the fire crews relating to the inspection process for 2016 and issued inspection assignments to the crews for the year.

*Your Sylvania Township Fire Department has highly trained professionals that conduct Extensive year-round training activities to maintain and improve their skills In a variety of disciplines to help our personnel to perform the wide variety of missions they may be assigned as the role of the Firefighter-Paramedic continues to evolve.*

Our 3 new Recruits continued their Training Program and completed 168 hours of required Life Squad Ride Time to be certified as a Lucas County EMS Life Squad Paramedic. They then moved over to Engine 61 to start the next phase of their training, focusing on Engine Company Operations and ALS Paramedic Fire Responder Techniques.

Ben Coppes, who came from our Part-time ranks and accepted a position as a Full-time Firefighter-Paramedic in January 2015, recently returned from a 1-year deployment with the United States Army in the Middle East. Ben was required to complete a Return to Work program, which focuses on all facets of the Fire Department and ensures that the individual is able to conduct all tasks per Departmental Standards. He then moved into his Life Squad Internship to acquire his certification.

Jason Fritz who also came from our Part-Time ranks, was recently hired to replace Scott Smith, who retired on February 2, 2015. Jason is currently finishing up his Life Squad Ride Time as well. Enjoy your Retirement, Scott!!!

February also had the first of our Quarterly Fire Inspector CE and review of the upcoming CBIP program. Ice Rescue Hands-on evolutions were cancelled due to good weather and a Safety Officer review was conducted in its place. We also held the Bi-annual Firehouse Training and Shift meetings to discuss the Departmental updates.



## **FIRE TRAINING BUREAU**

The Annual Fit Testing of our SCBA Masks was also conducted during February.

Lucas County EMS CE during February focused on Geriatric Emergencies and Burn Classification/ Treatment. The Sylvania Township Fire Department currently has 61 of the 62 Full-Time employees that are Paramedics.

Over 1780 hours of Training were conducted during the month of February that includes 265 hours towards Acting Officer Development Training, 91 hours of Recruit Training, and 330 Hours of LCEMS Paramedic Internship.
