Public Safety Education

During the month of June , Crews visited 148 homes and 10 smoke detectors were installed & 3 batteries were replaced this month by the fire crews.

Fire Crews "Returned to the Scene" in four neighborhoods this month, one from a fire that occurred this past winter and the other three for fires that have occurred.

Building and Project Plan Reviews

Notable Projects

During the month of June, Community Risk Reduction conducted 16 plan reviews, 9 license inspections for pre-school, daycare facilities and/or home inspections for adoption, 2 environment review requests (5941 Central & 5544 Alexis Rd.) , 2 consultations for future construction plans, 6 final acceptance test for installed or upgraded fire production systems or new businesses, and there were 4 public education events at the fire stations.

There were 386 fire safety inspections and re-inspections that were completed in the fire district during June.

In June, training for firefighters took place at the King Road Training Center, taking advantage of the pleasant weather.

The first half of the month focused on fire suppression tactics including, standpipe and sprinkler system operations, hose pulls and advancement, pump operations along with search and rescue.

The second half of the month focused on rescue-based emergencies. Crews reviewed methods used to stabilize overturned vehicles the first week. In the last week of June, all members got some hands-on practice using the heavy rescue equipment carried on Truck 64. After reviewing different tools used to lift heavy objects, a 3000 pound of piece of concrete was lifted, in a controlled manner, and repositioned. This scenario simulated having to move large object to rescued someone pinned by debris.

EMS STEMI FOLLOW UP

EMS Agency: LS # 5 and STFD DOS 06.06.14

- 61 y/o male had sudden onset of chest pressure and diaphoresis while seated at his desk at work.
- Patient received treatment for ACS from a team including Medics Dennis Kookoothe and Jared Davis along with 1st responders from STFD. Although initial ECG did not show STEMI, crew alerted TH EC that patient evidenced symptoms of STEMI. 1st ECG upon arrival to TH showed large anterolateral STEMI.
- Patient had a complicated course. He was able only to receive a balloon angioplasty to his LAD due to severe 3 vessel disease. An in-aortic balloon pump was placed and then he went to emergent open heart surgery same day for 5 vessel CABG. He had bleeding problems after the surgery and went home on 6/11/14. He is scheduled to begin cardiac rehab soon.

E2B time (time of first medical contact to artery open) time was **60 minutes**. His D2B time at TH was **37 minutes**. You definitely made a difference in this man's outcome.


