Community Risk Reduction

Public Safety Education

During the month of July , there were 1 public education event. The department issued 2 permits for above ground storage tanks (used for emergency power generators), and for removal of 5 underground storage tanks. 360 inspections and re-inspections were completed in July by the on-duty fire crews. The Chiefs and fire crews worked two Firework events for the Independence Day holiday celebration.



Building and Project Plan Reviews

Notable Projects

Fire Prevention/Community Risk Reduction conducted 16 plan reviews in July, 3 license inspections for preschool , daycare facilities and/or home inspections for Adoption and Foster Care, 3 consultation visits to assist local businesses in safety planning or to answer code questions regarding a planned project, 10 final acceptance tests for installed or upgraded fire protection systems or new businesses. Your Sylvania Township Fire Department has highly trained professionals that conduct extensive year-round training activities to maintain and improve their skills in a variety of disciplines.

The Fire Training Bureau strives to provide a challenging mix of hands-on and classroom training, as well as up-to-date knowledge to help prepare our personnel to perform the wide variety of missions they may be assigned as the role of the Firefighter-Paramedic continues to evolve.



July continued with Engine Company Scenarios at the King Road Training Facility. Hose pulls, advancement and deployment were covered. Search & rescue techniques, forcible entry evolutions, and pump operator methods were incorporated throughout the month.

We also reviewed all of our training facilities this month. Including the proper maintenance, preparation, policies and procedures. All personnel worked together to assist in keeping our Training Facilities in top notch form and to help develop our guidelines.

Sylvania Fire-EMS was specifically approached by Lucas County EMS, to trial the ResQCPR System from ZOLL Medical Corporation. Training was also conducted with the YMCA/JCC lifeguards. (See page 2)

The month concluded with the bi-annual Shift meeting. The Chiefs review current and upcoming topics within the Fire Department with our crews, answer questions and gather input and ideas.



Sylvania Township Fire Department

We are the second Fire-EMS department in the United States to use this device, which has been proven to have a 49 percent survival rate when used for cardiac arrest patients, and is a major step toward improving the odds of survival for our patients in the Sylvania Community. Our crews underwent additional training with the new system to be prepared to put it into service on July 15th.



The ResOCPR System is a combination of two medical devices used together during CPR: the ResQPUMP ACD-CPR Device and the ResQPOD ITD 16.



Trustee Neal Mahoney, and many of the media that were present, also participated in training on July 15th, which is when Sylvania Fire-EMS was the first in Northwest Ohio to put this newly approved device into Service and among the first in the U.S.

Training was also conducted in conjunction with the YMCA/JCC Lifeguards during their bi-weekly training session. We were asked to discuss what is expected of them when we arrive and run some scenarios to expand their knowledge base. Jeremy Gillen, one of our Water Rescue Instructors, developed the training in conjunction with Danielle Urbanski, Aquatics Director. The Lifeguards also got to try the ResQPUMP on manikins.



The ability to improve our service is generated through many ideas and initiatives that originate from our personnel. It is their values, energy, commitment, and compassion that drive many of the Fire Training Bureau's functions, programs, and activities that support the accomplishment of our mission of providing excellent service to the community.
